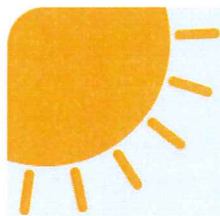




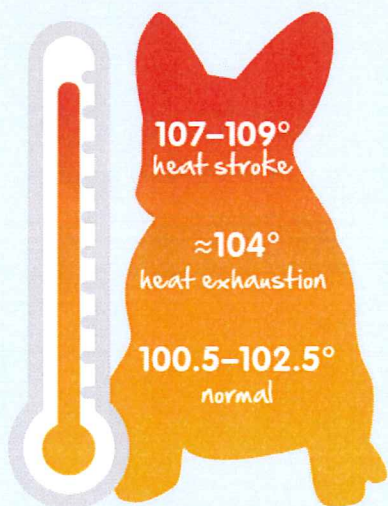
# spread the word, save dogs' lives!

## heat stroke in dogs

### a dog's body temperature



### signs of heat stroke:

- ⊘ Heavy panting, difficulty breathing, excessive thirst
- ⊘ Bright red tongue and mucus membranes, which turn grey as shock sets in
- ⊘ Thick saliva, drooling, vomiting, and/or diarrhea
- ⊘ Unsteadiness and staggering
- ⊘ Lethargy

⚠ By the time the signs of heat stroke are visible, it's often too late.
